They completely cleaned, scraped and painted the 80 foot camelback bridge at Fish Creek, near Lake Road on the south section of the FMHT. In addition, they painted the yellow bollards and barriers at the bridge and at Ferris Road and Lake Road. Their work will last several years and greatly improved the FMHT in this area. Don Stearns completed spring ditch mowing from Stanton to just beyond Grove Street in Greenville in late March and early April (about 35 miles). Many thanks to everyone who helps with this - our Trail is known for its great upkeep!

RESEALING COMPLETED FOR 2017

Thanks to the funds from the Mid-West Michigan Trail Authority and the Greenville Area Community Foundation, the FFMHT was able to reseal 7.3 miles of Trail this season. D & D Asphalt Co. of Midland was again the contractor. The Trail was sealed from Sidney Road south to Lake Road and from Peck Road in Greenville to Grove Street. This yearly resealing helps preserve the Trail surface and repairs cracks, making a more enjoyable ride for everyone. Many thanks to the two supporting organizations for allowing us to have this work done and to D & D Asphalt for their good work.

IN MEMORY (Heron Memorial Bench)

This year marks the loss of several volunteers who have been Trail Founders of the FFMHT. Harold "Hud" Springsteen and very recently, Bud Rogers have left us. These men have been Trail supporters and volunteers on many projects or the Board of Directors since the mid-1990's. They will be sorely missed. Additionally, John Heron (Board of Directors, volunteer, Vice President) died earlier this year, after a residence in Marquette, Michigan, at the Veterans Home there. His family received several donations dedicated to the FMHT at his funeral and sent them to the Board of Directors. The Board decided to use the money to have a memorial bench created for both John and Shirley - long time Trail supporters and workers. The bench is finished and engraved with their names. FFMHT Board member Dianne Wilson is working with the Village of Edmore to find a suitable spot within the Village limits to install the bench as a memorial to this wonderful couple. Keep your eyes open for this new addition. The Board hopes to have the bench installed before snow flies.

The third annual Bike More Edmore Ride (BME) took place on Saturday, August 19, 2017. This organized ride started at the trail head in Edmore then traveled south on the FMHT. It connected with the Flat River Trail in Greenville, then traversed around Baldwin Lake, and back to Edmore. This year we had 91 registered riders who enjoyed the great weather. The excess proceeds from this ride amounted to \$661.20 which were donated to the FFMHT trail organization.

Like last year, we had many returning riders (over seventy percent from previous years). We had a

group of riders from Sterling Heights, Troy, and Plymouth that started as a group of three on the first ride, and has grown to nine riders this year. Some of these riders are pictured sitting in front of the BME sign. This group hopes to grow even larger next year.

Thank you to all the people who helped organize and SAG this ride. Also, a big thanks goes out to the FFMHT committee and its volunteers who provided us with a great place to ride.



ANNUAL BANQUET A SUCCESS

The 23rd Annual Banquet and Fundraiser was held May 6 in Edmore at the Curtis Building. Nearly 140 attendees enjoyed a delicious meal prepared by Mary Ellen Coldwell. Many people found items to purchase at the Silent Auction. The Raffle drawings for a Raleigh bicycle, a Cannondale bicycle, and three trips for two people each to bed and breakfasts on Mackinaw Island, Bois Blanc Island, and in Ludington were greatly anticipated.
